## **General Conditions**

This CIC2\* is organised in accordance with the FEI Statutes, 21<sup>st</sup> Edition 2004, FEI General Regulations, 21<sup>st</sup> Edition, 2005, FEI Veterinary Regulations, 9<sup>th</sup> Edition 2002, FEI Rules for Eventing Events, 21<sup>st</sup> Edition 2005 and all subsequent corrections and modifications to the above Rules and Regulations as published by the FEI, the provisions of which shall take precedence.

An arbitration procedure is provided for under the FEI Statutes and General Regulations as referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies must be settled exclusively by the „Court of Arbitration for Sport“ (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland.

## **Invitations and Qualification**

### **Qualification of Competitors and Horses**

Each NF must certify the qualification of each horse and rider and list the competitions which enabled horse and rider to qualify, according to the qualification procedure established for each star level as laid out in Art. 506.

The qualifications must have been achieved in the current and/or two preceding calendar years. Deadlines for qualification are 2 weeks (for Championships 4 weeks) prior to the first day of dressage of the event.

When a qualifying result at a certain level is required (e.g. CCI1\*), a qualifying result at a higher level (e.g. CCI2\*) is also valid.

A specific type/level of qualification will automatically “drop down” a star level if conditions under point 6 are not met during the current and 2 preceding calendar years prior to the event and condition under point 7 has not been met or has expired (more than 2 calendar years have passed following the year in which the last qualifying result at that type/level has been achieved). The new level of qualification will last two more calendar years and eventually “drop down” again if during that period conditions under point 6 or 7 relevant to that type/level are not met and so on.

The following qualifying results have to be achieved:

Definition qualifying results:

- ☞ As of 2002 not more than 75 negative points in the dressage test and not less than 50% of Dressage good marks before 2002 as well as
- ☞ not more than 20 penalties at obstacles on the Cross Country Test as well as
- ☞ not more than 90 seconds exceeding the optimum Cross Country time as well as
- ☞ not more than 16 penalties at obstacles as of 2002 and not more than 20 before 2002 on Show Jumping Test

### **CIC2\***

**Two qualifying results must be achieved out of any of the following competitions:**

- ⇒ CNC to be certified by NFs of at least the same star level (two star) and/or
- ⇒ CCN to be certified by NFs of at least the same star level (two star) and/or
- ⇒ CIC1\* and/or
- ⇒ CCI1\* and/or
- ⇒ CCIO1\* and/or
- ⇒ CH1\*

### **Invitations:**

#### **Foreign Competitors:**

On invitation of the Organising Committee (total of max. 25)

Competitors who must be qualified acc. to para “Qualification of competitors and horses” will be invited through their home NF.

Per foreign competitor one horse of 6 years or older.

One groom per competitor.

#### **German Competitors:**

Total of max. 25 competitors

- a) Members of the Championship-, B-, B2 or S-cadre
- b) Competitors who have been nominated by the National Federation

Per German competitor 1 or 2 horses of 6 years or older. The number of horses will be determined by the national trainer Eventing.

## **Closing Dates of Entries (acc. GR Art. 121)**

Competitors wishing to compete in the event must be entered by their NF.

**Entries have obligatorily to be made via the online entry system. Passwords to enter the system and further information will be sent to the respective Federation in due time. The Organising Committee will not accept any other entries or incomplete entries.**

**1. Nominated Entries: Tuesday, August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2005**

Detailed entries with complete details. The online entry forms have to be filled out completely and correctly, otherwise the online system will not accept the entry. According to GR Art. 121.8.2., the list of the Nominated Entry may consist of a higher number of riders and horses than the Definite Entry, but in any case never more than double the number of the Definite Entry.

**2. Definite Entries: Thursday, September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2005**

The names of the riders and horses actually starting must be indicated and selected from those horses on the Nominated Entry list.

**Entries and changes of entries after the date of the nominated entry will not be accepted!**

### **Meeting Fee**

The meeting fee is € 150,- per horse. This includes stabling incl. first straw bedding.

### **No-show riders**

**Entry fees will not be reimbursed. In the case that a competitor who made his/her entry does not show up at the event, the Organizing Committee will charge the concerned NF with all relevant costs, i.e. hotel accommodation, stabling, entry fees, etc.**

## **General Rules**

### **Code of Conduct**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.**
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.**
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.**
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.**
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

1. The Organising Committee reserves the right, to make use of all illustrations (photographs, images, videos, etc.) made on behalf of the Organising Committee during the event or on the show grounds for their own commercial purposes, without explicit consent of the person/competitor illustrated.
2. The Organising Committee recognises the obligation of § 1.4 of the LPO for international events in Germany.
3. **Liability**  
The organiser declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organiser, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, fire or other incidents.
4. **Insurance**  
All owners, competitors, trainers and their accompaniments are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees/grooms, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The Organising Committee will **NOT** be responsible for any damage caused by competitors, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives.
5. **Medical Card**  
OCs must draw the attention of all competitors that they must carry a medical card easily accessible for the Cross-Country Test. Medical Cards must be collected by the OC upon arrival to the competition and checked by the official doctor and the TD.
6. **Event-Organisation**  
In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of NF Delegate, competitors and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.
7. **Cancellation of the Event**  
If special circumstances demand it, the Organising Committee reserves the right to take all necessary actions including the cancellation of the event by repaying the entry fee, with the approval of the FEI.
8. **Welcome**  
The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC to facilitate them on arrival. Date of arrival: 15<sup>th</sup> September between 8.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. Horses may not be unloaded without the authorisation of the Stable Manager. The stables will be available until Sunday, September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2005, 18.00 hours.
9. **Caravans/Trailers**  
Caravans/trailers of the participants - max. one caravan or trailer per participant - can be parked near the stables.  
  
Only the assigned place may be used. Electricity is supplied through installations in the stable area. Cable is to be supplied by the owner of the caravan / trailer.
10. **Stable Security**  
The following security regulations of the fire department must be obeyed:
  - Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable area.
  - Open fires (e.g. camping stoves) are strictly prohibited.
  - Only the actually needed amount of feed supplies may be stored in the stables.
  - Open space and entry ways between the stables may not be obstructed by trucks or lorries.Those who disregard the above security regulations will be reprimanded by the organising committee accordingly.
11. **Medical and veterinary services** as well as the service of a farrier are available during the show at the competitors own expense. Further information at the entry office.
12. **Sponsor Logos**  
The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.
13. **Settlement of accounts**  
Settlement of accounts per competitor. Reimbursement of prize money and possible further indemnities will be paid out by cheque only to the horse owners, competitors or their representatives, not earlier than one hour after the last competition of the event at the administration office on the show grounds. The Organising Committee is authorised to deduct any possible outstanding duties from the payment. Each competitor is obliged to forward the prize-money to the respective horse owner.

- 14. Taxation of Foreign Horse Owners, Participants and Grooms**  
According to § 50a - Abs. 4 EStG of the German Tax Rights the Organising Committee must detain tax from all accounts paid out to foreign horse owners, participants and grooms. Therefore, the total amount of tax payable will be deducted from prize money, reimbursement of transport, travelling, hotel, feed and bedding charges at the settlement of accounts at the administration office. The horse owners and participants can apply for exemption of these taxes at the German Federal Office of Finances, if the lawful requirements are met: Bundesamt der Finanzen, Friedhofstraße 1, 53225 Bonn 3, Germany, phone: (49) 228-4060, fax: (49) 228-4062661. An exemption of these taxes is only possible if the appropriate certificate is submitted. Subject to change.
- 15. Protests**  
All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150,- or equivalent.
- 16. Dogs are strictly forbidden on the show ground and the cross-country course!**
- 17. Head and Back Numbers**  
Each rider is responsible for head (identification) numbers; back numbers will be made available against a deposit of 20,00 €.
- 18. Course Inspection**  
It is forbidden, under penalty of disqualification, to inspect the course before they are officially open to the competitors or to leave the prescribed course during the competition.

## **Expenses and Privileges**

**There are no expenses paid for competitors and grooms.**

- 1. Entrance Passes (including stable area) will be given to**
  - a) competitors with one companion each
  - b) 1 groom per competitor

Entrance passes to the stable area according to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

**Show passes for horse owners are only available after the Organising Committee has received a request from the concerned NF by the closing date of the definite entry (May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2005).** The names of the owners must correspond with the horse owners registered in the FEI passport of the horse (GR Art. 133.1.).

**The entrance passes must be worn at all times on the show grounds. The passes will be withdrawn if they are passed on.**

- 3. Feed and stabling of the horses:**

Horses will be stabled from September 15<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup>, 2005 in the stable area at the tournament site only. First straw bedding will be provided free of charge. Feed is obtainable at current prices on the show grounds. Requests for bedding with shavings must be made by the closing date of the nominated entry (August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2005). The disposal of straw is free of charge. For the disposal of shavings a fee of € 16,- per box will be charged.

**Additional horses not participating at the CCI can not be brought along.**

## Veterinary Matters

### 1. **Veterinary Aspects** according to the Veterinary Regulations, 9<sup>th</sup> Edition 2002.

- a) **Veterinary Examinations, Horse Inspections and Passport Controls** will be carried out in accordance with Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1011; Rules for Eventing, Art. 518. General Regulations, 21<sup>st</sup> Edition 2005 will apply:

**General Regulations 21<sup>st</sup> Edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005 will apply:**

Art. 511.2.1:

All horses must be registered with the F.E.I

Art. 511.2.2:

Every horse entered at CCNs, CICs1/2\* and CCIs1\* in a foreign country, and all horses entered for CICs3\* and CCIs2/3/4\*, CCIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an Official FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 511.2.3:

Horses taking part in CCNs, CICs1/2\* and CCIs1\* in the country in which they are resident are not required to have such a passport as mentioned in Paragraph 2.2 above. All such horses must be properly registered with their NF and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

- b) **Horse-Inspection (according to time-table):**

- First Inspection acc. to Art. 518.2.5.3
- Second Inspection 18/09/2005 before jumping

- c) **Horse passport and veterinary documents** - including the health certificate for horses from foreign countries - are to be submitted to the **official show veterinarian** immediately after the arrival of the horses on the show grounds. These documents will also be handed back at the office of the official veterinarian - after payment of all expenses.

- d) **Equine Influenza Vaccination** (Vet. Regs. Annex VI)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI-Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

- e) **Sampling for Prohibited Substances** (Vet. Regs. Chap. V & VI and Annex III)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCIs3/4\*, CSIs (Category A), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. In CICs3/4\*, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art.. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

- f) **Medication Control Program** (Groups I & II only)

A fee of 10€ per horse toward the costs of the above program has to be paid with the entry fee.

- g) **Approved Laboratory** (Art. 1022 and Annex II) - Applicable only to Groups I & II  
Under the Medication Control Program (MCP) in Groups I and II, all samples collected (blood and urine) in accordance with VR Art. 1017.1 will be analysed by the

h) **Health Certificates**

At the time of the first examination, i.e. on arrival of the horses on the show grounds and before entering the stables, every competitor is obliged to have on hand the following health certificates:

- i) if the competitor comes from an EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex B of directive 90/426 EEC in the current valid issue;
- ii) if the competitor comes from a non-EU member country, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the current valid issue.

The certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.
